The Gospel Message is a message about *God*. It tells us who He is, what His character is, what His standards are, and what He requires of us, His creatures....The gospel starts by teaching us that we, as creatures, are absolutely dependent on God, and that He, as Creator, has an absolute claim on us.


The Gospel Message is a message about sin. It tells us how we have fallen short of God's standard, how we have become guilty, filthy, and helpless in sin, and now stand under the wrath of God. It tells us that the reason why we sin continually is that we are sinners by nature, and that nothing we do, or try to do, for ourselves can put us right, or bring us back into God's favor. It shows us ourselves as God sees us, and teaches us to think of ourselves as God thinks of us... Not till we have learned our need to get right with God, and our inability to do so by any effort of our own, can we come to know the Christ who saves from sin... For the very idea of sin in the Bible is of an offense against God, which disrupts a man's relationship with God. Unless we see our shortcomings in the light of the law and holiness of God, we do not see them as sin at all. For sin is not a social concept; it is a theological concept. We never know what sin really is till we have learned to think of it in terms of God, and to measure it, not by human standards, but by the yardstick of His total demand on our lives.

The Gospel Message is a Message about *Christ*--Christ the Son of God incarnate; Christ the Lamb of God, dying for sin; Christ the risen Lord, Christ the perfect Savior.

Two points need to be made about the declaring of this part of the message. (i) We must not present the Person of Christ apart from His saving work. (ii) We must not present the saving work of Christ apart from His Person.
