You may join more than one chapter. To stay on a chapter roll, you must be "actively participating" with that Campers on Mission chapter.

If you join more than one chapter, you must declare which chapter will be your "Home" chapter. This should be where you reside or if you are a fulltime RVer, the one you spend the most time.

Campers on Mission members accept short-term volunteer assignments across the United States and Canada. There are many mission opportunities for them to be a part of, depending on their interest and availability.

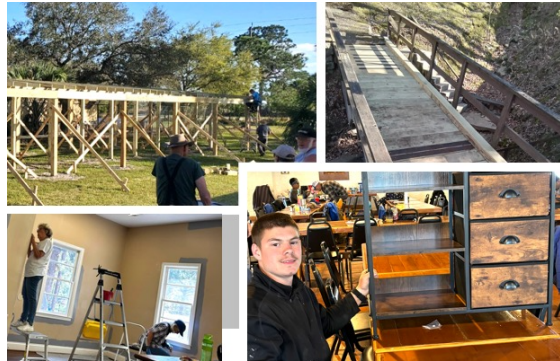
COM Projects and Opportunities

Construction Projects

Skilled Trades

Licensed workers are wonderful, and those who know a lot about the work can do it followed by an inspection by a licensed contractor.

- Plumbers for repairs and installation
- Electrician for minor work as well as wiring a new building
- Heavy equipment operators are needed on some jobs



Sewing Ministries

- Sewing curtains, potholders, aprons, etc. for campgrounds
- Making cloth bags for foster children to keep their personal items in when they are moved
- Making "As We Go" bears for children
- Various other items for children, senior adults, homeless, etc.

- Fairs, Puppet Ministries, etc.
